EXAMPLES OF DISCRIMINATION:



- Firing or demoting someone based on factors other than job performance.
- Denying a student with a disability the use of a service animal.
- Firing a woman just because she is pregnant.
- Creating school policies that could provide different treatment for students of different races, religions, sex, etc.
