



WHAT IS ANTISEMITISM?

Definition

According to the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance, the following has been the non-legally binding working definition of antisemitism since 2016.*

"Antisemitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred toward Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of antisemitism are directed toward Jewish or non-Jewish individuals and/or their property, toward Jewish community institutions and religious facilities."

*The U.S. adopted this definition through a Presidential Executive Order in 2019.

Reporting Hate Crimes

In Pennsylvania, a hate crime is defined as a criminal act motivated by ill will or hatred toward a victim's race, color, religion, or national origin. Contact your local police department or Pennsylvania State Police if you are reporting a crime that you believe was motivated by hate, such as assault or property damage.
